

My Testimonial & Tribute to Mr Chen (April 2011)

In July 2010 I was diagnosed with cancer of the pancreas. The tumour, situated at the head of the pancreas initially measured 33mm and had metastasized to my liver. Therefore the Whipples operation was not possible. My liver was resected in August 2010, removing some of the cancer lesions. The only further option for treatment then was to undertake a course of chemotherapy, which I began in October 2010.

At this time, my cousin Kim, who is an Associate Professor of Newcastle University in Medicine, contacted me saying that she had researched Traditional Chinese Medicine. She recommended that I contact Mr Chen at Ryde, who had a good reputation for successful treatment of cancer, combining his skills in TCM with Western treatment of chemotherapy and radiation therapy etc.

Mr Chen began my treatment in October 2010. He spoke to me quietly but confidently about the importance of boosting my immune system in fighting the cancer. Through his treatment of acupuncture and Chinese Herbs and advice about meditation and a correct diet, he explained that this holistic approach, would be supportive of the chemotherapy treatment.

My latest CT Scan in March 2011 has shown a significant reduction in the size of the tumour, which now measures only 14mm, and the complete absence of any liver lesions. My specialist was delighted to explain to me that I am now in remission!!!

I know without a doubt that remission from pancreatic cancer would not have been possible with chemotherapy alone. The TCM administered by Mr Chen has kept me well throughout my treatment. I have not caught a cold or virus, even though people have been sick around me. My Oncologist has remarked that my blood tests have consistently shown very good results and my tumour marker has decreased from the original reading of 620, to the current reading of 14.

Thanks to Mr Chen I now enjoy a much better quality of life and I am very hopeful about the future. I am very thankful that the initial grim prognosis of having just


12 months to live, that I was given by other doctors, is not necessarily the inevitable outcome.
